## Who's On First, when it comes to Black Baseball?

*Come and join us in Birmingham and celebrate 100 years of baseball.*

With apologies to Abbott and Costello, come and help us celebrate the **"Glory Days: A Salute to the Negro Leagues in the South & Rickwood Field."**



**Who is on first:** We are the first committee in SABR to host a conference dedicated exclusively to the history of Black baseball.

**What is on Second:** What our mission is to research and preserve the history

of blacks in baseball before the re-integration of the game and provide respect, redemption and recognition to this important chapter of American history.

**I Don't Know is on Third:** If you don't know about the Negro Leagues, Birmingham is the place to be. Some of the best baseball minds in the country will come together and share their knowledge and resources about this passionate period of Americana.

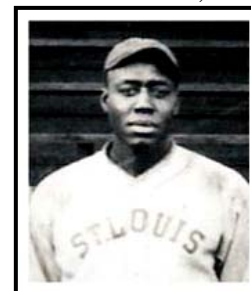

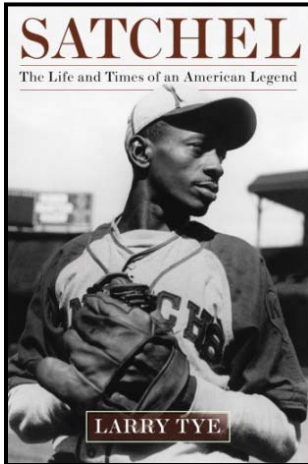

## Congratulations . . .

### Larry Tye wins the Seymour Medal for “Satchel”.

In *Satchel: The Life and Times of an American Legend*, Tye provides an exhaustively well-researched look at one of the most intriguing personalities of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. One of 12 children, Tye takes the reader through Paige’s introduction to baseball in reform school, the years he spent setting unbelievable records in the Negro Leagues, his major league debut at an age (42) when most players are on the verge of retirement and his life after baseball.



The Seymour Medal selection committee said of the book that it’s “*Written about a man who died 30 years ago, but it’s like he’s walking through the pages of this book.*” *Satchel* was also a 2009 *New York Times* Notable Book.

Tye received his award at the Seymour Medal Conference, April 30-May 2 at the Radisson Hotel Gateway in Cleveland, Ohio.

Last year, he presented “Satchel Paige, a ball player at the Crossroads and in the Lead” at the 12<sup>th</sup> annual Jerry Malloy Negro League Conference in Pittsburgh. Tye was honored with the **Robert Peterson Recognition Award**, for bodies of work that increase public awareness of the Negro Leagues.

### The Hank Aaron Museum is Officially Dedicated.

On April 14, 2010, the Hank Aaron Childhood Home & Museum opened in Mobile, Alabama. Five other Hall of Famers – **Willie Mays**, Reggie Jackson, Ozzie Smith, Bruce Sutter and Rickey Henderson – along with Commissioner Bud Selig dedicated the museum at Hank Aaron Stadium, home to the Mobile BayBears, a Double A affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks.



The crowd of more than 600 toured the seven room museum that features exhibits ranging from how the house looked when Aaron was growing up, along with items about Aaron’s start in baseball. A replica of the Aaron family kitchen and the room where he and his brother, Tommie, slept are featured. The Museum will also house several items from the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, NY.

**JAMES ANDREW KASTRO**, 55, died April 23, 2010, in Fairview Park, Ohio. Kastro served as the financial officer for the Jerry Malloy Negro League Conference for several years. He was also past president of SABR’s Jack Graney Chapter based in Cleveland. Donations in Jim’s memory can be made to the Trinity Special Olympics, SABR and the Second Harvest Food Bank. The humorous and articulate Kastro will be missed by all of us in SABR.

**FERNANDO ALBERTO “MAMAVILA” OSORIO**, 83, died March 24, 2010, in Chitre, Panama. Osorio pitched for the 1949 Louisville Clippers.

**JAMES “FIREBALL” COLZIE, SR.**, 89, died March 10, 2010 in Miami, Florida. Colzie pitched from 1937 to 1949 for several teams, including the Macon Colored Peaches, Albany Black Travelers, Atlanta Black Crackers and the Indianapolis Clowns. He also played for the 1943-45 United States Air Force Military baseball team.

## Sol White’ burial site needs a Marker

Efforts are underway to raise funds for a plaque or marker to honor Hall of Famer **King Solomon White** (June 12, 1868 - August 26, 1955). White is buried in an unmarked pauper’s grave with five or six others in the **Frederick Douglass Memorial Park**, Staten Island, NY, in Section G, Grave 18, Row 7. The cemetery does not allow headstones for a person in a multiple grave.



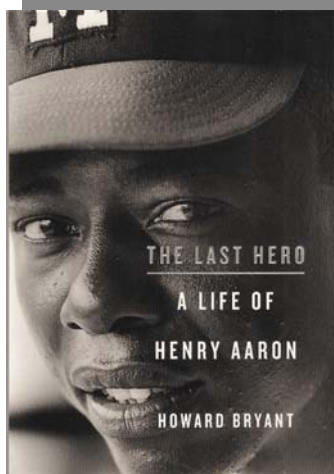

His 1907 book the **History of Colored Baseball** was the first definitive history to discuss black baseball. White’s almanac begins with the organization in 1885 of the first professional colored baseball team. The executive, manager and former infielder was elected to the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 2006.

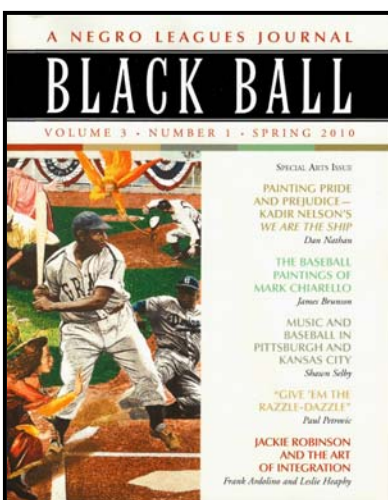

**The Last Hero: A Life of Henry Aaron by Howard Bryant**

Bryant, a finalist for the 2003 Seymour Medal for *Shut Out: A Story of Race and Baseball in Boston*, has published the ultimate biography on Hank Aaron. In his latest book, Bryant examines Aaron's most complex second act: his quest to become an important voice beyond the ball field when his playing days had ended, his rediscovery by a public disillusioned with today's tainted heroes, and his disappointment that his career home run record was finally broken by Barry Bonds during the steroid era, baseball's greatest scandal.



The ESPN writer reveals how Aaron navigated the upheavals of his time – fighting against racism while at the same time benefiting from racial progress – and how he achieved his goal of continuing Jackie Robinson's mission to obtain full equality for African Americans, both in baseball and society, while he lived uncomfortably in the public spotlight. Eloquently written, detailed and penetrating, this is a revelatory portrait of a complicated, private man who through sports became an enduring American icon. Through the assistance of SABR's Negro Leagues Research Committee, the chapter was able to contact the heirs of O'Neil's estate and received formal approval for the name change on April 8, 2010.

Chapter President, Matthew Keelean, states, “*We are most grateful to Buck and Ora Lee O'Neil's family and heirs for their support and kind consideration of our request and are honored to be able to rename our chapter the Buck O'Neil Chapter. We look forward to carrying on Buck's legacy through our activities and events, promoting the richness and diversity of the game beloved by our chapter's inspirational namesake.*”
