Overall, they brought new spirit and energy in revitalizing the 15-year old symposium.

Other presentations included a crowd pleasing story about "The Woman Who Saved Satchel Paige for Cleveland" by Donald Spivey, along with Todd **Peterson's** discovery of "The Greatest Catcher in America: George "Chappie" Johnson." Chris Lamb set the story straight about "Did Rickey Sign **Robinson** to right a 40-year-old wrong?"
